This week was an exciting week in math. Students have now transitioned from learning multiplication to learning all about division. This week we worked a lot with manipulatives and drawing to see the relationship between multiplication and division. Those students who have been working really hard to memorize their multiplication facts have already noticed how easy this is making division for them. Please help your student by working with them daily.



In science we talked about people's place in the ecosystem. We explored words such as natural resources and recycling.
