What is Title I?

Cook Primary School is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement policy.

School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Cook Primary will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Cook Primary values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Cook Primary will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it revised?

Cook Primary School invited all parents to attend our annual School Forum last spring to review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, as well as the schoolwide plan, our school-parent compact, and the family engagement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through an online form. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online and by mail to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parents and family members can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year including our annual Community Cares event.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Cook Primary School will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan is included in the student handbook that is given to all students. As a reminder, we will email the plan to all parents in August before the scheduled Open House event. The plan will also be posted on the school website and social media. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center.

2019-20 District Goals

All schools in the district will increase mastery of Georgia Standards of Excellence, develop a rigorous and consistent curriculum for all students, develop systemic assessment practices, and prepare students for college and career success.

2019-20 School Goals

Cook Primary School will establish 90-100 minute uninterrupted blocks of instruction for both English Language Arts and Mathematics. Grades K-1 will implement a new phonics curriculum. Grades K-2 will implement a new mathematics program.

School-Parent Compacts
