# Distance Learning for Parents FAQ

#### 1. Who can I contact for questions about the learning activities?

Please contact your student's teacher for questions regarding learning activities.

### 2. Who can I contact if I need technology support?

At www.rockyhillps.com next to Home Connections, you will find:

- Quick Reference Guides on how to help your child use the various online educational apps and tools.
- A link to an online form to request tech support. The form will ask you for your student information and a call back phone number in the event that we need to reach you.
- A link to offers from Cox who has pledged to provide free and discounted internet access to qualifying families.

## 3. How should I prepare the home environment for school?

- Please determine a space in your home that will be dedicated to completing each day's learning activities.
- Be prepared to access the school-provided Chromebook (2-12). If there is another device available at home, be sure that your student can access the same programs he or she can access at school.
  - If you are unable to obtain Internet access due to financial hardship and would like assistance, please email <u>connect@rockyhillps.com</u> so we can help! All emails will be kept confidential.
- Remember to incorporate time to move! It is common for students to get up and move around, wiggle, or even chat with friends multiple times throughout the day.

#### 4. Will my student participate in live learning?

At this time, given the variability of Internet access, bandwidth, and student availability, regular education teachers will not be providing live-stream learning. Specialized services may, for individual situations, utilize teleconference communications.

### 5. How much "screen time" should I expect for my student?

- a. Prek-1: Student learning will be paper/pencil based. Online resources will be referenced and shared via ClassDojo or SeeSaw.
- b. **2-5**: Math and Reading will each include 45-60 minutes of technology-centered learning activities each day. Additionally, students may engage in another 30-45 minutes of technology-centered learning activities each day.
- c. 6-12: All learning activities will be accessed via the online learning platform, Google Classroom.

#### 6. Will my student take unit/curriculum assessments during this time?

- a. Prek-5: The plan to assess student learning is currently being developed and will be shared at a later point in time. In the meantime, families should keep all completed work.
- **b. 6-12**: Unit/curriculum assessments will be included, as appropriate, via the online learning platform, Google Classroom.

# 7. How much time should I expect my student to engage in each distance learning day?

- **a. Prek:** Your child's teacher will be in touch regarding programming for your child.
- **b. K-5**: Each distance learning day has been designed to last between 180 and 200 minutes. Families can arrange the time in the way that best fits their student's needs each day.
  - Do the Learning Activities have to be completed in order?
     It is not necessary to complete the activities listed in order. However, it is important that students complete all activities for the day.
- **c. 6-12**: Students are expected to log into Google Classroom as they would for a typically scheduled school day.

# 8. How are we providing Support Services (Literacy, Math, ESL, and Special Education)?

As information becomes available regarding support services, it will be communicated by your child's support services teacher.

9. Are students expected to turn in assignments while learning from home?

Students will be receiving guidance from their teacher(s) regarding the due dates for assignments to be submitted.
