After graduating from Mary Persons High School in 1991, Mrs. Branch attended Presbyterian College in Clinton, South Carolina. For a brief few semesters, she thought of becoming a journalist and even interned at a local newspaper, but upon beginning student teaching, she knew teaching was her true calling.

She interviewed at the Houston County Job Fair at HCHS, and there she met Mr. Dyson. After an interview at Northside and multiple phone calls, Mr. Dyson offered her a job one week before her college graduation.

Her first year of teaching was 1995-1996, and that year she taught Ninth Grade Literature, American Literature, and British Literature, and she also co-sponsored the Debate team. As the years passed, Mrs. Branch went on to sponsor Students Against Destructive Decisions (S.A.D.D.), the sophomore class, the yearbook, the newspaper, and the Senior Class. One of her favorite things is to help guide and facilitate students' plans for events and their lives. School Meal Data

A study was recently conducted in Houston County of the affets of students who began eating breakfast at school prior to not eating and found that students who began eating breakfast at school grew academically at a rate 18% higher than those students who did not eat breakfast at school, had a 14% higher attendance rate, and had 21% less discipline referrals. Food for thought: all students at Northside have access to free breakfast and lunch. This resource has been found to increase attendance and academic performance, and lower discipline referrals. Please encourage your children to eat both breakfast and lunch.
