Guidelines for Early Graduation

Early graduation is defined as graduation from high school by the end of the first semester of the fourth year of high school. Students must meet 5 of the 6 criteria listed below to be considered as a candidate for early graduation.

 1. A student must have good attendance during all the high school years. No more than 5 unexcused absences any school year.		
 2. A grade point average (GPA) of no less than 3.2 on a 4.0 scale or an average of 91 on 100 point scale.		
 3. A score of 4.0 or above on the Writing Assessment.		
 4. A Gateway score at the advanced level on Algebra I, English II, and Biology, or a minimum of 21 on the ACT.		
 5. A student must have an exemplary record of conduct during the high school years; including but not limited to the following:		
a. No in-school suspensionsb. No out-of-school suspensionsc. No assignments to alternative school		
 6. A student must provide proof of enrollment into an institution of higher learning, a job training program, or an apprenticeship program.		

The students graduating early may return for graduation ceremonies at the end of the school year.
