

## SAB APPROVES SALARY INCREASES FOR 2021-2022 SCHOOL YEAR

The Riverview Gardens School District's Special Administrative Board voted 3-0 to approve weighted salary increases on the 2021-2022 salary schedules.

The salary increases fulfill a promise made during the Proposition E campaign to enhance salary schedules and provide fair and equitable salary increases for District employees. Prop E passed with the support of 68.6 percent of voters in the April 6 election.

Under the approved salary schedules, the overall weighted average salary increases are as follows:

- <u>Teachers</u> 7.5%
- Custodial 7.71%
- Food Service 9.87%
- Nurses 6.86%
- Clerical 8.70%
- Maintenance 8.66%
- Instructional Assistants 6.01%
- MIS 9.22%
- <u>Security</u> (DSO) 4.73%
- Administrators 5.0% (Flat Increase)

The estimated budget impact for the 2021–2022 school year is \$2,092,341.02.
