Tips for M.A.P. Testing

The students have been wellprepared for M.A.P. testing. The teachers address the Missouri Learning Standards multiple times throughout the year and the goal is for students to demonstrate mastery of those standards.

Students know what kinds of questions to expect and they have strategies to help them answer different kinds of questions. We have also been helping students to build stamina for reading and responding to test items.

All that remains is for students to give their best effort to this assessment. You can help in the following ways:

- Students need to be at school, on-time, every day.
- Students need to arrive at school well-rested.
- We provide breakfast, but some children choose to eat breakfast at home.
 Please ensure that your child gets a well-balanced breakfast that is low in sugar and high in protein.
- Write a letter of encouragement for your child to read before each testing session. Notecards will be provided during parent-teacher conferences for this purpose.

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
