

# WIDA ELD STANDARDS

The WIDA English Language Development (ELD) Standards represent the social, instructional, and academic language that students need to engage with peers, educators, and the curriculum in schools. The WIDA standards include examples of how language is processed or produced within a particular context through Model Performance Indicators (MPIs). MPIs are meant to be examples and not fixed guidelines of the language with which students may engage during instruction and assessment.

## STANDARD 2 LANGUAGE OF LANGUAGE ARTS

English language learners communicate information, ideas and concepts necessary for academic success in the content area of language arts.

## STANDARD 3 Language of Mathematics

English language learners communicate information, ideas and concepts necessary for academic success in the content area of mathematics.

## STANDARD 4 LANGUAGE OF SCIENCE

English language learners communicate information, ideas and concepts necessary for academic success in the content area of science.

## STANDARD 5 LANGUAGE OF SOCIAL STUDIES

English language learners communicate information, ideas and concepts necessary for academic success in the content area of social studies.
