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## **West Point Consolidated School District Reopening Plan**

**June 29, 2020**

For the 2020–2021 school year, the West Point Consolidated School District plans to offer traditional in-person learning with a distance learning option. Earlier this summer, parents were asked to complete a survey to indicate their intentions for the upcoming school year. The result of the survey indicated 51% of parents intend for their students to return to the traditional classroom setting and 49% intend for their students to participate in the distance learning option.

During registration, parents will select an option for their child. Parents will be given an opportunity to change instructional options during the week of August 31-September 4, 2020. At that time, students will attend school based on the option chosen through the end of the first semester. On December 18, 2020, parents will have an opportunity to reevaluate their decision.

Expectations for both options for the Fall are listed below.

### **In-Person Option**

- Please practice self-screening at home. It is recommended that parents take their child's temperatures before the student leaves home. Do not send students to school with fever of 100.4 or higher. Employees should self-screen before leaving home.
- Temperatures will be checked daily. Students and employees with temperatures of 100.4 or higher will be isolated and sent home.
- All students and employees must stay home if they have COVID-19 symptoms, tested positive, or had close contact with a person with COVID-19 within the last 14 days.
- Cleaning/disinfecting of building surfaces and high touch objects will be done more frequently.
- Buses will be cleaned/disinfected after each route.
- Masks will be worn when social distancing is not feasible.
- Schools will require administrative approval for visitors, and all visitors will be screened.
- Meetings will be held virtually.
- Students will not eat in large groups.
- Where feasible, rooms will be arranged with all students facing the same direction, and students will be spaced out as much as possible.

### **Distance Learning Option**

- Distance learning will be age and grade appropriate.
- The distance learning schedule will be set by the building principal and teachers.
- For those who choose distance learning, students will need access to reliable internet and devices. The district is in the process of purchasing devices for each student and teacher. Due to high demand of devices, we cannot guarantee the devices will be available when school starts.
