SCHOOL

Cottage Hill Christian was established in 1961. The high school portion of the Cottage Hill Baptist School System began in the fall of 1997. The first graduating class was in May of 2000.

ACCREDITATION

Cottage Hill Christian Academy is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS), the Alabama Independent School Association (AISA) and holds membership in the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI). Cottage Hill Christian Academy is also awarded the status of a Blue Ribbon School by AISA.

GRADUATION

Two diplomas are offered for graduation: Honors Diploma and College Prep Diploma. College-prep requires 25 units of academic work and Honors requires 27 units of academic work. Courses are offered at Dual Enrollment (DE), Advanced Placement (AP), Honors, and College-prep levels to prepare students for success in college. A compiled course offering list is located on back.

GRADING SCALE

A = 100-90, B = 89-80, C = 79-70, D = 69-60, F = 59-0

A student's cumulative GPA begins in the 9th grade continuing through the completion of 12th grade. Dean's List with Highest Honor, Dean's List with Honor and Dean's List are calculated with the weighted GPA for 1st, 2nd & 3rd quarters.

STANDARDIZED TESTS

All freshmen are administered the PSAT 8/9 and Pre-ACT, all sophomores are administered the PSAT and Pre-ACT, and juniors are administered the PSAT and the ACT. Of the school's eighteen graduating classes, eight have had either a National Merit Commended Scholar or National Merit Finalist.
