SUBJECT: COURSE SYLLABUS

1. **References**

- a. Army Regulation 145-2.
- b. Cadet Command Regulation 145-2.
- c. Cadet Command Regulation 145-2-3.

2. **Purpose** To establish policies and procedures for the expectations and requirements for cadets enrolled in the Junior ROTC Program at Pike County High School.

3. **General**. You will be taught from a nationally recognized curriculum used in JROTC programs from around the world. We will be using the latest in classroom technologies. Expectations will be high in that your grading will reflect national standards; not local or state.

4. **Weekly Schedule**. Our weekly training will take place as follows:

- a. Monday - Physical Training/Drill & Ceremony
- b. Tuesday - Classroom
- c. Wednesday - Uniform Inspection
- d. Thursday - Classroom
- e. Friday - Physical Training

A training schedule will be posted on the Bulletin Board and in each classroom and on the bulletin board in the hallway. It is the responsibility of each cadet to review the training schedule to see what will be instructed each day, as well as, any homework assignments.

5. **Curriculum**: Depending on your Leadership, Education, and Training (LET) level you will receive instruction in one or more of the following academic areas during the semester:

- a. Unit One Citizenship in Action
- b. Unit Two Leadership Theory and Application
- c. Unit Three Foundations for Success
- d. Unit Four Wellness, Fitness, and First Aid
- e. Unit Five Geography and Earth Science
- f. Unit Six Citizenship and American History and Government

1. **Grading.** Grading will consist of the following components:

- a. **Examinations** - Major, pre-announced tests given every few weeks when finishing a particular unit: 30%
- b. **Uniform** - Grade will be given based on the state of your appearance in uniform every Wednesday; if you don't wear the uniform all day on Wednesday you will receive a zero (no exceptions): 50%
- c. **Participation** - Subjective grade given by your instructors based on your participation in the classroom, after school JROTC activities, as well as, conduct on campus and other classrooms: 10%
- d. **Quizzes** - Grades from pop quizzes are given by your instructor: 10%

2. **Discipline.** Since our **mission is produce good citizens we expect a very high moral and ethical code in JROTC than you are probably used to.** We will use the following means to enforce required discipline:

- a. Students/Cadets who miss 1 Uniform Day, Suspended or sent to the Alternative Learning Center (ALC) and if they are a discipline problem in any teachers classroom will not be allowed to attend any JROTC Field trips or participate in Organization Day activities. Also if you do not have a valid excuse for missing our Annual JROTC Military Ball the above discipline standards apply.
- b. Elite Teams are the following: Drill Team, Color Guard, Marksmanship Team, Physical Fitness Team (PT) and Academic Bowl/Knowledge Team. Students must have a "C average" before they can sign up for one of these teams. Students must also maintain that average for the entire year if they want to continue to be a member of an Elite Team.
- c. Rank - The only way to be promoted is through desirable behavior based upon your leadership potential and good discipline. You can also be demoted through poor behavior.
