Teachers Will:

Parents Will:

- Attend digital “BRIGHT” Nights provided by the school.
- Use resources including flash cards, websites and apps to review math concepts presented in the fluency folders.
- Check that reading texts provided by teacher are being completed nightly.

Students will:

- Use strategies taught at the digital “BRIGHT” Nights by the teacher when completing classwork, homework and tests.
- Integrate flash cards, games, websites, and apps when reviewing concepts listed in fluency folders.
- Read 20 minutes nightly to support reading fluency.
