

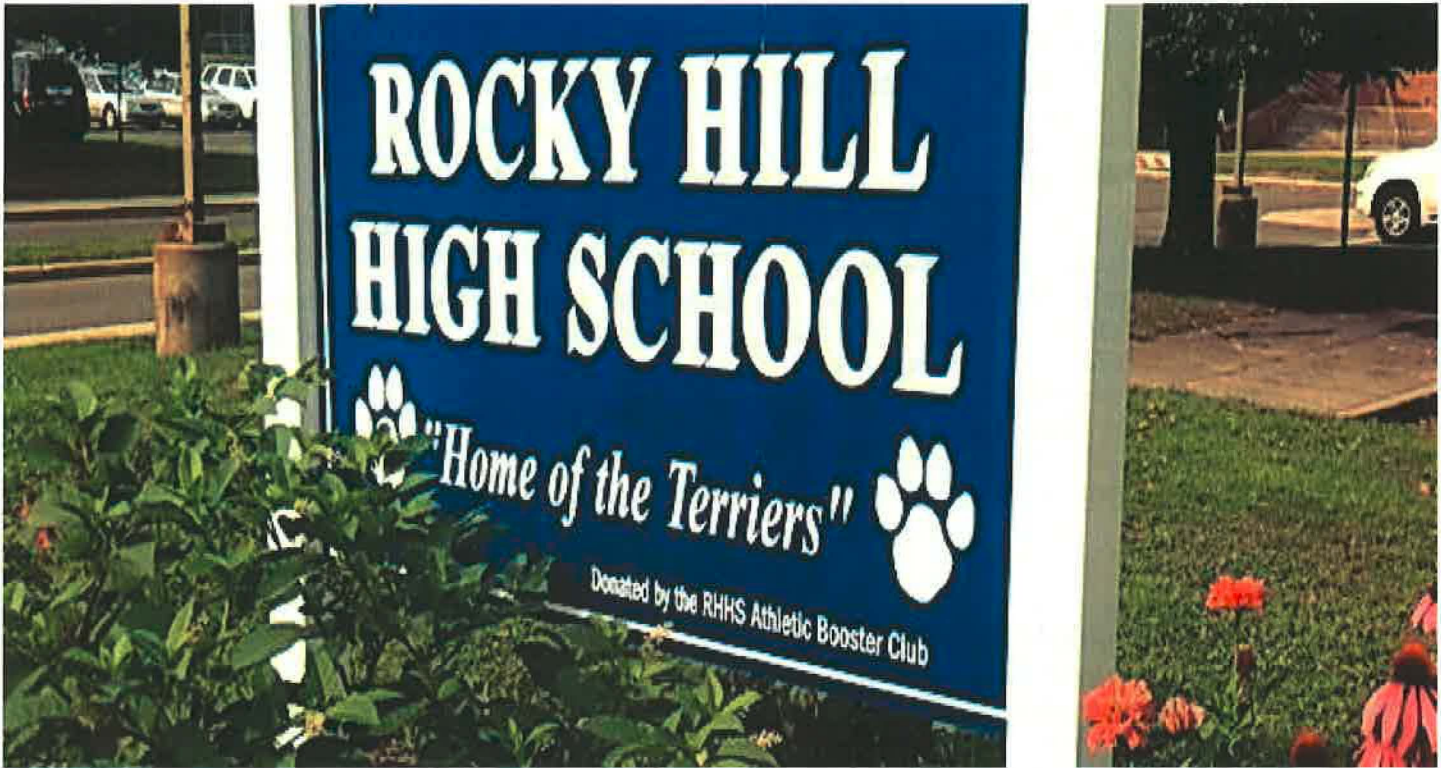
Higher Education Plans

Mission Statement: Through high expectations and a challenging curriculum, all students at Rocky Hill High School will become responsible citizens who embrace learning as a lifelong process in an ever-changing world.

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School

Rocky Hill High School is a four-year comprehensive high school offering curricular and co-curricular programs to approximately 740 students in grades 9-12. Accredited through the New England Association of Schools and Colleges, the school offers a wide range of courses in college and career preparation. In 2012, 89% of the seniors received acceptances to four and two year colleges, 2.6% other schooling, 1.6% military, and 6.8% entered the workforce.

Freshman Transition Course

A Freshman Transition class will provide ninth graders with the skills they need to be successful in high school. Activities in the class are designed to provide and refine skills needed to begin an effective transition from the middle school academic environment to the more rigorous high school curriculum. Topics will include study skills/test preparation, academic goal setting, career planning & course selection, conflict resolution & team building, and school climate.

Community

Rocky Hill is a suburban community with a population of approximately 19,000, located eight miles south of Hartford, Connecticut. It is comprised of middle-income homeowners, most of whom work in professional, industrial, mercantile, and business environments of the greater Hartford area.

Curriculum

Rocky Hill High School is a four-year comprehensive secondary school offering college preparatory, general education, and vocational skills courses. All course offerings are leveled, with the degree of difficulty and amount of preparation identified for each course.

AP: Advanced Placement / UCONN

Level 1 (H): Honors program

Level 2 (A): Academic program preparing students for competitive four-year colleges and universities

Level 3 (G): General education program to reinforce skills or to introduce students to new areas of learning.

Class Rank

Rank is calculated by assigning a numerical equivalent to each grade within the assigned curriculum levels of academic difficulty. The quality points range from 4.50 for a grade of 90 or above in an Advanced Placement Course to (0) for any failing grade. A student's class rank is determined at the end of each year and after the 7th semester.

Special Academic Programs

Advanced Placement (AP) courses are offered for Calculus, Statistics, U.S. History, Modern European History, Comparative Government & Politics, Psychology (*proposed 2013-2014*), Chemistry, Spanish, French, Latin (*proposed 2013-2014*), and Language & Composition.

UCONN Early College Experience students may receive college credit in Biology, Chemistry, Modern European History, Individual and Family Development, French, Spanish V, and Latin (*proposed 2013-2014*).

Middlesex College Career Pathways Program students have the opportunity to earn and transfer up to thirteen college credits at no charge. Courses are taught by high school faculty at the high school during regular school hours.

Virtual High School classes offer students over 200 online courses in art, business, foreign language, language arts, life skills, math, science, social studies, and technology courses as part of their regular school day.

Project Lead the Way is a flexible four-year program designed to prepare students to be successful in post-secondary engineering and engineering technology programs.

The Greater Hartford Academy of Math & Science and School of the Arts provide students with educational experiences that extend the teaching and learning of science, mathematics, technology, music, drama, and art beyond the traditional classroom.

Alternate Learning Programs provide a structured, individualized learning environment for special education students who might otherwise encounter difficulty in regular classroom situations.

Independent Study Programs are offered in a subject not included in the curriculum or in an area which is an extension of enrichment of the curriculum.

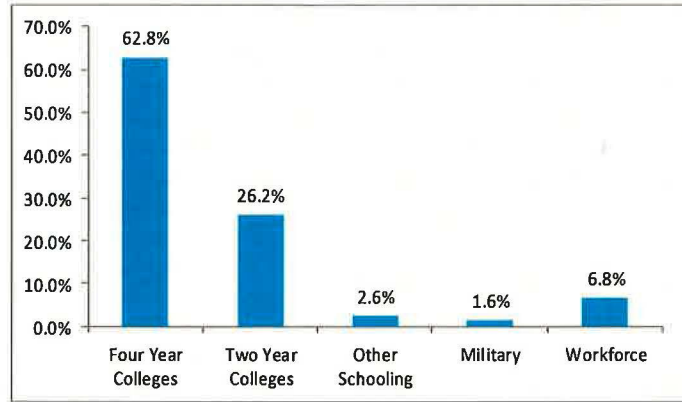
Selected students are offered Algebra I in grade 8, and/or French and Spanish in grades 7 and 8, with the same course content and examinations as high school students. No high school credit is awarded, but students are able to enroll in Honors Geometry, Honors Algebra II and/or the second year of the language as a freshman.

A Teaching Assistant/Peer Tutoring program offered by National Honor Society members provides one-to-one support for students in all academic subjects.
