Dear Parent:

Meadowview Middle School has been identified by the Tennessee Department of Education as a "High Priority" school in School Improvement 1, Improving. While some subgroups did not meet state and federal goals in Mathematics in the 2009-2010 academic year, I am thrilled to share with you that all subgroups met state and federal goals in math in the 2010-2011 academic year. Our math achievement and growth is outstanding. Results of spring test scores indicate that all of the district's middle schools met state and federal goals in mathematics. Thirty percent of the state's elementary and middle school students scored proficient to advanced in math and 44.5% scored proficient to advanced in reading. At the high school level, 56.7% of the state's students scored proficient to advanced in mathematics (Algebra I) and 39.4% scored proficient to advanced in reading (English II). The state's graduation rate is 86.1%.

Because Meadowview Middle is a Title I high priority school, your child is eligible to transfer to another public school in the district. You may choose to transfer your child to one of the following schools:

If you choose to transfer your child, please be aware of the following:

- The district will provide or pay for transportation to and from your child's Choice School as long as Meadowview Middle is a high priority school identified for improvement. If Meadowview Middle meets achievement goals for two straight years, it will no longer be a high priority school.
- Your child will be allowed to remain at the new school until he/she completes the highest grade.
- If funds are not available for all students to be transported, priority for transportation will be given to lowest achieving students from low-income families.
- If requests for a Choice School exceed that school's capacity, priority for first choice will be given to lowest achieving students from low-income families.

Our school continues to work hard to increase student achievement in math and reading by the following:

- Tutoring services with certified teachers
- Math labs during the school day that identify specific math problems and provide individualized instruction
- Provide instructional technology for all classrooms and student use
- Increased the rigor in all student classrooms, encouraging student engagement and challenging work

We encourage your help by working with your child to complete math and reading assignments, working on multiplication facts, attending parent meetings and trainings, attending parent conferences in September and October, and allowing your child to stay for tutoring services offered at Meadowview.

If you would like for your child to transfer, you must complete the attached form. Return it no later than August 21, 2011, by mail or hand delivery to the Meadowview Middle School office or to the Office of Federal Programs located in the Central Office at 210 East Morris Boulevard. A self-addressed stamped envelope is included for your convenience. The Office of Federal Programs of the district will notify you by phone and/or mail to provide transportation information and the date your child may start attending the Choice School.
