Dear Parent,

As to comply with the new provisions of the Parents' Right To Know under the **No Child Left Behind Law** put forth by the U.S. Department of Education, school districts must provide parents with the right to know about the quality of their children's teachers.

The law clearly states that at the beginning of each school year starting with the 2002-2003 school year, school districts must notify all parents of children attending Title I schools that they can request information regarding their children's classroom teachers, and any other professional staff providing educational services to their children.

This includes, at a minimum, information on (1) completion of state requirements for licensure and certification; (2) emergency or other provisional status; (3) educational background; and (4) whether paraprofessionals are serving the child and, if so, the paraprofessionals' qualifications.
