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#### **Drama 3: Advanced Theatre**

Welcome to Mrs. Thompson's Drama III class. This sheet can be found in the class folder at all times since it contains important information about the class. The purpose of Drama III is to give you a chance to further develop your skills as a performers, theatre scholars and critic. The course includes a number of virtual productions that allow students to apply their advanced acting skills and knowledge. Virtual performances via remote learning will occur throughout the year. These formal performances will count major assessments. **All performances are MANDATORY!** This course is designed to enhance theatre appreciation.

### **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

Emphasis will be placed on **more advanced** acting techniques such as acting styles, monologues, and character development. Work will also include non-acting skills such as playwriting, play analysis, elements of design, costuming and stage make-up. Students will engage in theatrical performances of monologues and scenes via Google Meets or Webex. The course will include the critique and evaluation of pre-recorded theatrical

This class requires you to perform with and for your peers. You may find this to be challenging, but don't get discouraged! Take academic and performative chances: participate in class discussions, and

raise your hand to volunteer an answer to a question. It is ok to make mistakes; that is how learning happens.

All grades will fall under two categories this year: 60% major grade and 40% minor grade. Each student will be given one 40% grade each week and one major grade every three weeks.

Students will be counted absent if they do not log onto Schoology each day of the school week. If a student logs onto Schoology and interacts with my class, they are counted present that day. If they do not interact with my class from 12 a.m.-12 a.m. on any given day, you are counted absent for that day.

Lastly I understand that behavior inside the virtual classroom is an important factor of being in an Advanced Class therefore, any behavior that demonstrates a lack of honesty, integrity and commitment (bullying, inability to get along with others, etc.) will be grounds for dismiscal from both virtual performances and the remote
