



# Literacy-Based Promotion Act Annual Report of Performance and Student Retention

The Literacy-Based Promotion Act (LBPA) was enacted to improve the reading skills of Kindergarten and First through Third The Literacy-based Promotion Act (LBPA) was enacted to improve the reading skills of kindergarren and First Introgri Find Grade students enrolled in the public schools so that every student completing the 3rd grade is able to read at or above grade level. This report displays the components required under the guidelines of the LBPA, which include the number and percentage of students: scoring at each performance level on the state assessment in reading and math, taking the alternative assessment, being retained at each grade level Kindergarten through 8th grade, passing for good-cause exemptions; and any revised district policies for promotion and retention.





## Students Promoted by Good Cause Exemption

- 0 (0) A. Limited-English Proficiency with less than two Years in English Learner Program
- 0 (0) B. Students with disabilities for whom participation in statewide accountability system is not appropriate
- 0 (0) C. Students with disabilities receiving two years intensive remediation and previously retained
- 0.(0) D. Students tested on an alternative assessment (for 2014-2015 this is an alternate form of the 3rd Grade Summative Assessment)
- 0 (0) E. Students receiving two years intensive remediation and previously retained for two years
