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### **Course Description**

English II is intended to enhance students' abilities to comprehend, analyze, and evaluate works of literature as well as to develop clear written expression. English II continues to reinforce the skills learned in English I, specifically focusing on the four language arts - reading, writing, speaking, and listening. Students will be exposed to various types of literature and informational text, and the emphasis of developing written expression will be stressed. Students will analyze works of literature and explore their various themes and connect those themes to our current society. Students will be expected to write three types of essays over the course of the year: narrative, expository, and argumentative. Grammar skills will be an important part of this course, and all essays will be expected to have little to no grammatical errors. In addition to writing, students will also be expected to develop a research project using MLA format.
