Play "Rock, Paper, Scissors, Math" with a partner. After player say, "Rock, Paper, Scissors" the last call-out is "Math". With that call, each person lays out 1, 2, 3, or 4 fingers in the palm of their hand. The first player to say the correct product of both players' fingers wins.	Write a "What if" story to explain what might have happened if a discovery had not been made (such as electricity, washing machine etc.).	Write about the time you felt you were treated unfairly.
