What is Title I?

In support of strengthening student academic achievement, Villa Rica Elementary receives Title I, Part A funds and therefore must jointly develop with, agree on with, and distribute to parents and family members of participating children a written parent and family engagement policy that contains information required by section 1116(b) and (c) of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). The policy establishes the school's expectations for parent and family engagement and describes how the school will implement a number of specific parent and family engagement activities, and it is incorporated into the school's plan submitted to the local educational agency (LEA).

School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Villa Rica Elementary will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Villa Rica Elementary encourages the input of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement and providing premiere experiences. This plan describes different ways that the school will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at the school and at home.

How is it revised?

Villa Rica Elementary invited all parents along with teachers in the month July to engage in reviewing the School Wide Plan, the Family Engagement Plan, School Parent Compact, and the Family Engagement Budget. Parent input and comments are solicited at a separate input meeting as well as through an online form on the Villa Rica Elementary website. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online and by mail to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parents and family members can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Villa Rica Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

The plan is located on the school website and a hard copy will be in the parent engagement notebook in our Parent Engagement Center (in the front office), and with our Family Engagement Coordinator.

Jointly Developed?

The following plan was jointly developed with parents in an organized, ongoing, and timely manner in the planning, review, and improvement of Title I programs, including opportunities for regular meetings, if requested by parents, to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their child and respond to any such suggestions as soon as practicably possible.

2019-2020 District Goals

- The percentage of students scoring at Proficient or above on the Georgia Milestone Assessment (GMAS) Mathematics End of Grade Assessment will increase by 3% points.

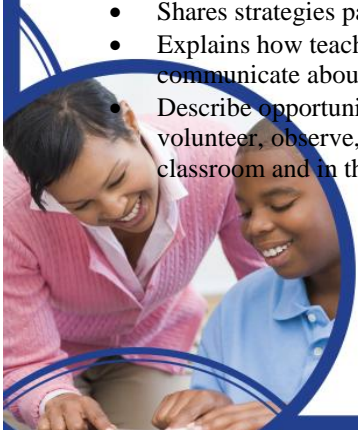

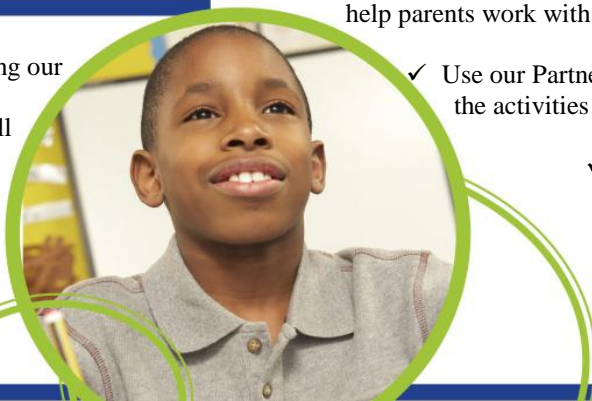
Parent and Family Engagement

Villa Rica Elementary will take the following measures to promote and support parents and family members as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our school goals. We will:

- ✓ Ensure that all information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities is published in both English and Spanish, posted on the school website, and included in the monthly school newsletter for all families.
- ✓ Provide monthly trainings for staff during their planning periods on strategies to improve communication with parents and ideas to increase family engagement with reading and math activities for our students outside of the classroom. Staff will also share best practices during regularly scheduled faculty meetings.
