Students and parents are not the only ones back to school this August. After settling in to classrooms, New Milford Public Schools staff held their annual convocation on August 20th. Superintendent JeanAnn Paddyfote welcomed the group, introduced new staff, and shared a short video of students' "Favorite Part of School", a nice reminder to all of just why they teach. The convocation continued with the introduction of New Milford's 2015-2016 Teacher of the Year. Following the meeting, district staff continued with professional development, staff meetings and student welcome activities—all while eagerly waiting for their students to return on August 24th.

#### Jennifer Singer

Each year, parents, students and fellow staff members are invited to nominate a teacher for selection as New Milford's Teacher of the Year. The nominee must have taught in the district for five or more years and have demonstrated continued excellence of performance during his/her tenure. A Selection Committee then considers all the nominees based on the following guidelines:

- Demonstrated ability to inspire enthusiasm and motivation for learning in students.
- Demonstrated use of effective teaching techniques, flexibility of style, innovation, and creativity.
- Caring relationships with students.
- Demonstrated commitment to continuing professional growth and development.
- Respect and admiration of students, colleagues, parents, and administration.
- Personal philosophy and goals.
- Ability to articulate ideas clearly.

The Committee was pleased to select **Mrs. Jennifer Singer**, a Grade 3 teacher at SNIS, as this year's New Milford Teacher of the Year. Mrs. Singer's educational background includes a Bachelor of Arts in Political

Science with a Minor in Psychology from Fairfield University and a Master's Degree of Education from the University of Bridgeport.

Mrs. Singer (then Miss McStravick) started her teaching career in New Milford where she served as a student intern and then as a student teacher at Hill and Plain School. Recommendations even then spoke of her capacity to become an exceptional teacher. Mentors described Jen as an able, enthusiastic and creative student teacher with a true natural gift for teaching. One HPS teacher remarked that Jen "instinctively knew just which students needed help and how to help them and demonstrated a nurturing and caring attitude with all the children." Another stated "it is already clear that Jennifer will be a rare talent as a teacher."

It is no wonder then that when an opening arose mid-year for a grade 4 teacher, Jen was hired. Now some eighteen years later, Mrs. Singer has also taught grade 2 and, most recently, grade 3 students at HPS. This year, she has moved with her fellow grade 3 teachers to SNIS.

Throughout the years, Mrs. Singer has shared her professional expertise at both the building and district level. She has been involved in curriculum and professional development initiatives, has served on her school's Character Education Committee, and has been a PTO teacher representative. She has also served as a mentor to several colleagues.

SNIS Principal Anne Bilko says "Jen is a wonderful choice for this year's Teacher of the Year. She is a passionate educator who sets high expectations for students and works tirelessly to see them meet with success. She is a consummate professional, both in the classroom and out."

"We change young lives every day and truly make the world a better place. Your influence on your students each year cannot be measured, but know that each and every one of us leaves a piece of ourselves with them. Every child deserves a champion, an adult who will never give up on them, who understands the power of connection, and insists that they become the best that they possibly can be. Be that champion this year. I am so grateful to work with the children of New Milford and I feel very honored to be named New Milford's Teacher of the Year."


Mrs. Charlene Kirkwood

## Developing Good Homework and Study Habits

As the new school year begins, we offer these suggestions from the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) for developing good homework and study habits.

- Create an environment that is conducive to doing homework. Children need a consistent work space in their bedroom or another part of the home that is quiet, without distractions, and promotes study.
- Schedule ample time for homework.
- Establish a household rule that the TV and other electronic distractions stay off during homework time.
- Supervise computer and Internet use.
- Be available to answer questions and offer assistance, but never do a child's homework for him or her.
- Take steps to help alleviate eye fatigue, neck fatigue and brain fatigue while studying. It may be helpful to close the books for a few minutes, stretch, and take a break periodically when it will not be too disruptive.
- Some children need help organizing their homework. Checklists, timers, and parental supervision can help overcome homework problems.
- If your child is having difficulty focusing on or completing homework, discuss this with your child's teacher, school counselor, or health care provider.
