The faculty and English Department at TA will be equipping your student in these areas:

- To challenge and seek a firm foundation in comprehension, writing, vocabulary, and grammar
- To excel and ignite a personal growth for knowledge
- To search for truth (John 14:6)

Each book list will apply to students entering that grade in the fall. Students will be responsible for reading <u>TWO</u> books over the summer. First, each will determine their book of choice and complete a reading and writing assignment prior to the start of school. Secondly, the "MUST READ" selection will engage students in making wise decisions. Both books must be read by the student <u>before</u> the first day of class. <u>No audible books, movies or any assisting aids should</u> be used in lieu of an actual or electronic book.

Students enrolled in Mr. Smith's English classes will take a test and turn in a written report on their book of choice on the **second day of class**. The two page paper will be in a 12 font Times New Roman, with one inch margins, typed, and single-spaced. (Spelling Counts!) The assignment will be worth a total of 100 points.

Students are required to take clear and concise notes on EACH chapter for recall, tracking, and important details about the story. <u>Your handwritten notes will be turned in with your report. The total number of chapters of your book is required in a chapter sequence for your notes.</u>

<u>NOTE:</u> A student and parental signature *is required* on the correct Title form and stapled to the top of your written paper before submission. <u>No late papers will be accepted!</u>
