Students will receive their first set of vocabulary words on Monday. Please study for 10 minutes each night. We will begin centers on Tuesday. Math	This week we will be learning more about our math workshop. Each day we will learn how to play a new math game or complete a new math activity. In the first activity of math workshop, students will practice multiplication facts using Xtra Math, multiplication war, multiplication dots, and flash cards. We will also begin the number of the day review, which is the second activity. This review will have students practice basic math skills, such as addition, subtraction, even, odd, writing numbers in various forms, as well as multiplying by one-digit numbers. As students show mastery of these skills, new review skills will be added. The third activity will be weekly work, which will be solving word problems. The final step of math workshop is the challenge.
