God of peace, bring your peace to our violent world: peace in the hearts of all men and women and peace among the nations of the earth. Turn to your way of love those whose hearts and minds are consumed with hatred. God of understanding, overwhelmed by the magnitude of this tragedy, we seek your light and guidance as we confront such terrible events. Grant that those whose lives were spared may live so that the lives lost here may not have been lost in vain. Comfort and console us, strengthen us in hope, and give us the wisdom and courage to work tirelessly for a world where true peace and love reign among nations and in the hearts of all.

Technology

The SJRCS middle school teachers met to discuss Google Classroom and indicated that the current layout of a single Google Classroom is not working as effectively as planned. Therefore,

your child will receive invites from individual subject area classes as we create separate Google classrooms for each subject area. This new format will start on Monday, September 14.

Please note that many teachers will start using the Zoom program to broadcast their lessons, which provides more control of the chat feature and offers additional features that are not available within Google Meet. Teachers have noted that some students are not using their digital etiquette when utilizing the chat feature.

Please remind students to have cameras on during lessons for interaction with teachers. The teachers' engagement with our digital learners is effective when the students are visible participants. Please remind students to refrain from watching TV, and chatting with friends, and playing video games during lessons.
