Dear Nautilus Parents,

Greetings from Nautilus Elementary School!

We are thrilled to be able to provide in-person learning beginning on October 12.

Please remember, for the safety of our students we cannot allow parents on campus or on the playground. Also, we are still unable to allow volunteers in the classrooms. We will update you, when this changes.

As you know, we will be following CDC and Governor Ducey's mitigation (safety) protocols to ensure everyone's safety. Although our city has lifted the mask requirement, the schools must comply until the governor waves the order. Please continue to send your student with a mask and water bottle. We will maintain distancing when as much as possible and allow for mask breaks when appropriate. Current drop off and pick up procedures will remain the same as the hybrid model. Thank you in advance for staying in your vehicles and allowing staff to take care of your children.

NURSES NEWS

School resumes in-person

We ask that you follow this daily checklist before sending your child to school. If your child displays any of the following symptoms please keep him/her

home and report it to our attendance and health office.

*Fever of 100.4 or higher

*Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing

*Chills, Coughing *

A student with daily runny nose or congestion due to allergies should NOT be kept at home. In the event your child gets sick at school, please have a plan in place of who can pick him/her up if you are not available. Students will need to be out of school as quickly as possible for any symptoms. Your diligence will help us keep our students and staff safe.

Immunizations

Thank you to all the families that have updated your students' immunizations! I know what a challenge it can be especially now. If your student still needs immunizations for school, you should have heard from me recently. *Lice: The nurse is always on the lookout for lice. Please take the time to check your student's hair for these little insects. The nurse has information on lice and how to rid your family of them. They do not fly or jump, they crawl. They cannot live more than 24-48 hours without a host. They feed on human blood. Your student is most likely to get lice when sleeping overnight at someone's house. Pets do not get or carry head lice. • Watch for signs of lice: Itching, Nits, and/or Visible lice.

Parents should check their student's head before and after any sleepovers or camps. Remember, it will take several weeks for signs of lice to become obvious. Due to confidentiality, we cannot per policy inform parents of students that are being treated or identify classes

Reduced/Free Meal Application

We encourage every LHUSD family to complete an application for Free or Reduced Price Meals. Not only does this help us identify families in need of assistance, it also allows the District to receive federal dollars for classroom

programming. You can submit a meal application through the Titan Family Portal (<https://family.titank12.com>) for the current school year - without having to sign up for meal payments.

Student Drop-Off and Pick-Up

The student drop-off and pick-up system at Nautilus is effective and safe when everyone follows the procedures! We are continuing to use the same drop off and pick up as we have during our hybrid model of learning. The following are some “tips” to use the system more effectively!

- Please drop off students at the green curb at ANY point where you have stopped. Do not wait to be at the front of the drop off line to drop them off.
- Have students enter/exit the right side of the vehicle, if possible, as the left side is a driving lane.
- Please pull into the left lane when students have exited or entered the vehicle, to allow others to move forward and drop off their students. When students are “dropped off” in the right lane, drivers may pull into the left lane and continue on their way. Las Vegas schools call this set-up the “kiss and go lane”! Parents give their child a “kiss” as they leave the car each morning and then “go” on to their workday!
- Park in the parking lot if your child needs help exiting the vehicle or you want to make sure they go into the building.
- Please continue to move the line forward and if you have K-1 sign in your window, we will be directing you forward to the K-1 pickup area
- Please do not park in the second line as that is exit lane only or for K-1 parents to move forward safely to bus zone.
- We will utilize the time on the Marquee for opening school to breakfast and doors to go to classrooms.
- PLEASE and THANK YOU for being patient with each other and staff as we do the best to safely get students back in the cars or to your vehicles. Remember we no longer can congregate in front of school as we have done in the past.

Title I School-Wide Programs

As a parent of a student in the Lake Havasu Unified School District #1, under the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001, you have a right to know the professional qualifications of the teachers who instruct your child. The No Child Left Behind Act gives you the right to ask for the following information about each of your child’s classroom teachers:

- Whether the State of Arizona has licensed or qualified the teacher for the grades and subject he or she teaches
- Whether the teacher is teaching under an emergency permit or other provisional status by which state licensing criteria have been waived
- The teacher’s college major; whether the teacher has any advanced degrees and, if so, the subject of the degrees
- Whether any instructional aides or similar paraprofessionals provide services to your child and, if they do, their qualifications. If you would like to receive any of this information, please contact the front office at 505-6060.

Parents’ Right to Know Notice

Dear Parents or Guardians:

We are pleased to notify you that in accordance with the Elementary and Secondary Act (ESEA), as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), you have the right to request information regarding the professional qualifications of your child’s teacher. Specifically, you may request the following:

- Whether the teacher has met State qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction.
- Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or substitute status.
- The baccalaureate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate certification or degree held by the teacher, and the field of discipline of the certification or degree.
- Whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.

If you would like to receive this information or have any questions, please contact your child’s school principal.



Parents Right to Know
