Evaline Highly Capable Annual Notice:

WAC 392-170 requires that all school districts identify and serve their most highly capable kindergarten through grade 12 students and provide them a continuum of services.

WAC 392-170-035 defines highly capable students as "students who perform or show potential for performing at significantly advanced academic levels when compared with others of their age, experiences, or environments. Outstanding abilities are seen within students' general intellectual aptitudes, specific academic abilities, and/or creative productivities within a specific domain. These students are present not only in the general populace, but are present within all protected classes according to chapters 28A.640 and 28A.642 RCW."

In accordance with WAC 392-170-060, WAC 392-170-075, and WAC 392-170-070 the Evaline School District uses multiple criteria, universal test measures, and a Multi-Disciplinary Selection Committee (MSC) to identify students who fall generally in the top 10 percentiles for cognitive ability.

Also, in accordance with WAC 392-170-045, Evaline has a referral process by which parents and teachers can provide further insight to the aptitudes and abilities of a child who they wish to recommend for highly capable services. Nomination forms can be found in our school office and can be picked up at the office or can be e-mailed or mailed upon request. The open nomination window is from April 26, 2021 to May 21, 2021.



All students who attend Evaline in grades kindergarten through sixth will have the opportunity to be universally screened for highly capable services using multiple criteria and results from the Cognitive Ability Test (CogAT). Students who test in the top 10th percentile will be automatically referred to the MSC to determine whether they qualify for highly capable services.

In accordance with WAC 392-170-076 the Evaline School District has written procedures for appeal.

Happy Earth Day Week Fabulous 4th graders!!!

This week in math we continued our application of fractions within word problems as well as in more complicated equations. In ELA we placed extra focus on learning about what a biography was, and beginning to write one about someone we admire. We have also been making great progress in our cursive writing practice in Handwriting, and in Health we looked at ways we can practice self care and how to support positive self esteem in ourselves and others with kind words, thoughts, and actions. We have also been discussing as a class, use of our current Read Aloud book, the importance of making the "right" or honorable decisions, and having healthy boundaries and rules. In Science, our focus has been both on earthquakes, as well as on Earth Day related topics and activities. We have been able to incorporate both social studies and art in our Science and Health lessons this week, which really brought that knowledge to life for many of our students.

A few requests for our 4th grade parents. First, please continue to remind our fabulous fourth graders to review their checklists daily and complete all assigned tasks, whether they are online or in paper form. I know with the good weather we are starting to have they may be tempted to put off doing their homework, but when it isn't done by the next morning they end up feeling behind, or having to miss recess to catch upm which we would like to prevent. Secondly, if a student is needing to be absent from live learning or switching to distance learning for any period of time, please remember to arrange for pick up of their assignments which are put out front of the school daily at 2pm, and we will also arrange extra support on zoom with Mrs.Fletcher or another staff member as needed to teach or review new or challenging concepts. MR. BURLINGAME **5TH AND 6TH GRADE**

Hello Parents and Students,

This week we have been hard at work finishing up our math chapters in both classes and taking chapter math tests. 5th grade worked on multiplying fractions where one factor was a mixed number or a fraction and 6th grade learned about solving algebraic equations and finding solutions to inequalities. Their next chapters will center on fraction division for the 5th grade and understanding the relationship between variables in 6th grade.

ELA saw us getting close to finishing the Renaissance unit in 5th grade and each student will be completing the unit next week with a short biography of their choosing about Brunelleschi, Da VInci, or Michelangelo. 6th graders have completed the unit on Bud, Not Buddy and are now starting to organize information for a research paper on their own "rules to live by".

The class is continuing their study on volcanoes with a look at how lava deep inside the mountain attributes the shape of the mountain as well as what kind of rock is formed by eruptions. They also figured out why the lava type is a major cause in the type of eruption that a volcano may have.

5th graders have now moved into a lengthy unit on the United States government beginning with the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution. They will study the three branches of government, their roles, and their checks and balances. We will finish up with a look at local government as well. 6th graders have completed their unit on the Roman Empire and are now looking at the power, social, and knowledge vacuum created by the retreat of the empire as Europe enters the medieval period.

This year is quickly coming to an end and before we know it we'll be looking at summer vacation. There is still a lot of work to be done and students in my class are working hard to complete it. I am proud of the work that they've done and the growth they've shown this year. I look forward to finishing this year strong with several more fun units for students to complete before they are gone for the summer.
