Objectives/Essential Skills:

Anticipate the interests of consumers by current trends.
Understand and explain the differences between income, expenses, assets, liabilities and depreciation.

Classroom Policies (Learning to Do, Doing to Learn, Earning to Live, Living to Serve)


- **Learning to Do** (Active Participation):
