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CONTROL OF PESTS ON SCHOOL PROPERTIES



With regards to our management of the use of any pesticides that would be used on District properties: the District follows procedures to ensure the safety of children, staff, and patrons of our community, to ensure we have a healthy environment. The District will utilize customary and effective practices to control structural, nuisance, and landscape pests.

Pests are defined as living organisms that, by situation or size of population adversely interfere with the health, safety, functional, or economic goals of humans. Pesticides, including herbicides, used to control pests can pose health risks if used indiscriminately.

Integrated Pest Management (IPM) is a sustainable approach to managing pests by combining biological, cultural, physical and chemical tools in a way that minimizes economic, health, and environmental risks. IPM emphasizes preventing and reducing pest problems by using active, non-chemical control practices, as well as pesticides, including herbicides.

To minimize risk from pests and pesticides, the District will implement an Integrated Pest Management program, which will be used to prevent and address pest problems. Applications will not be done whenever students are present. Whenever applications are made, property will be posted with signs to alert staff, students, and community. Applications will be made around school and community scheduled use of the property. The District makes the application of pesticides infrequently and very cautiously, and with signage. Whenever an application is planned, notice will be given via a flyer given to staff, sent home to students, and postings on the property at least 48 hours in advance.

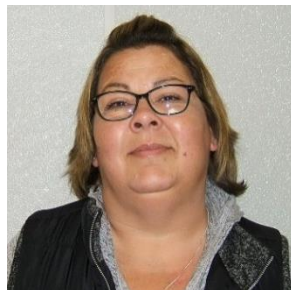

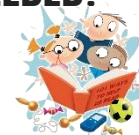
