- 3. Responsible for all mechanical, electrical, and tire work, on both school buses and other vehicles owned and operated by the school system to the extent the school system supplies necessary equipment.
- 4. Responsible for regular inspection, service, and preventive maintenance on buses and other school vehicles.
- 5. Available to assist with other school maintenance, in times of emergency.
- 6. Maintains buses to a degree that meets or exceeds state codes.
- 7. Maintains a clean and safe repair shop.
- 8. Maintains inventory (parts and supplies) in an organized manner.
- 9. Maintains tools and equipment to provide maximum life.
- 10. Maintains no association to any commercial garage or shop.
- 11. Performs other duties, as assigned by the Transportation Director or Superintendent.
