

APPEASEMENT AND THE START OF WWII

TREATY OF VERSAILLES REGULATIONS

- Germany had to accept blame for WWI
- Forced to pay over \$30 billion in reparations
- Germany lost territory (Alsace-Lorraine, the “Polish Corridor”, the Saar coalfields, etc.)
- Rhineland was demilitarized
- Germany’s armed forces was limited to 100,000 men

1935

Hitler announces the expansion of the Wehrmacht to 600,000 members - 6 times the number permitted by the Treaty of Versailles





1936

Hitler claims Germany feels threatened and sends forces in to occupy the Rhineland

union with
Austria. This
was also
forbidden by
the Treaty of
Versailles








Hitler next claims that his last territorial demand is the Sudetenland - a part of Czechoslovakia where 3 million ethnic Germans lived. However, it was also home to 66% of Czechoslovakia's coal, 70% of its iron and steel, and 70% of its electrical power.

Without those resources, the Czech nation would be vulnerable to complete German domination.






