### 2G readers can:

- Recognize and read irregularly spelled words
- Make the initial sound for blends and digraphs
- Read a 2G text with sufficient accuracy and fluency
- Ask and answer questions about key details in a text

### While working in this level, 2G readers learn to:

- Retell stories in correct sequence, including key details
- Understand central message or lesson
- Identify the main topic and retell key details
- Describe characters, settings, and major events using key details
- Describe the connection between two individuals, events, ideas, or pieces of information
- Identify words and phrases that suggest feelings or appeal to the senses.
- Ask and answer questions to help determine the meaning of words and phrases
- Explain differences between books that tell stories and books that give information
- Know and use various text features
- Identify who is telling the story at various points
- Distinguish between information provided by pictures and information provided by words
- Use illustrations and details to describe characters, setting, or events
- Use illustrations and details to describe key ideas
- Identify the reasons an author gives to support points
- Compare and contrast the adventures and experiences of characters
- Identify similarities and differences between two texts on the same topic
- Recognize and respond to punctuation

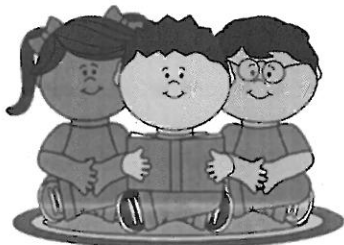
