Course Description:

Students will trace the geography, government, economics, and history of Asia and Africa. The geography domain includes both physical and human geography. The government/civics domain focuses on selected types of government found in various areas in order to help students understand the variety of governments in the world. The economics domain focuses on shifts from the U.S. to how other countries answer the basic questions of economics. The history domain focuses primarily on significant events in each region from the 20th and 21st centuries.

Assessments & Grading:

Minor Assessments (example: Quizzes, Mini-Projects)	30%
Daily Assessments (example: Homework Checks, Project Progress Checks)
