Jerry Knute is Dedicated to Fixing those Aches and Pains



When it comes to relieving aches and pains for young and old, Jerry Knute, a 1972 graduate of Alvarado High School has few peers who can match his expertise of administering that relief. His work as a Physical Therapist at the North Valley Health Center in Warren has been a labor of love for him and the hundreds of people he has treated for the past 36 years.

His journey to become a PT

began just northwest of Tabor where he was born and raised and where he lives today. His first six years of education were spent at a one-room country school west of Tabor where he was the only student his age. He started at Alvarado in 7th grade and graduated in 1972 with a class of 20.

His most vivid memory as an elementary student was wading in a ditch full of water, in the spring, until it just got over his boots (didn't we all?). He also remembered all the fun athletic competitions his school would participate in with other area country schools. His teacher was Donna Pape who went on to teach in Oslo. He stated, "She must have done a great job because a lot of valedictorians and salutatorians came from that little country school. I, of course, was not one of them."

He moved on with his education to Alvarado High School in the fall of 1966 as a 7th grader. He continued on down memory lane saying, "We had an extremely close class and I made friendships that have lasted a lifetime. One of my fondest memories was being part of the 1970 basketball team that won the district and went on to the region tournament (he didn't say, but that district championship was won over the Warren Ponies). I was student manager of the basketball team for four years and I attempted to play baseball for a couple of years. I also played alto saxophone in the band and although I hated acting, I directed our senior class play. I was always better at giving orders than taking them. I enjoyed science and math classes, but I most enjoyed the debates we would have in history with the girls".

Jerry's family is a great source of pride for him. He is married to Dorene who works in the Medical Records department at North Valley Health Center. They have four children, three who are WAO graduates. Daughter Stacey is an oncologist in Lincoln, Nebraska. Son Matt owns a computer software business in Colorado Springs, Colorado. Son John is in his first year at the University of North Dakota and is planning a career in Physical Therapy. Son Seth will graduate from WAO High School in 2013.

When asked what led him to pursue a career in Physical Therapy, he responded by saying, "Being the student manager for Alvarado's basketball team, I acquired an interest in sports medicine. I researched programs to go into where I could continue with sports medicine and PT seemed to be a good choice. I and one of my classmates got accepted into the PT program at the University of North Dakota. Of the 24 students in the program, three of us were accepted for a trial rural option program and were able to do our senior clinicals in the summer and then graduate in December of 1975."

With the experience gained during that time period, Jerry was ready to begin his career. He started PT departments in Warren and Karlstad in 1976 and worked four different facilities in the two towns until 1980 when he became busy enough to go fulltime in Warren. He added, "Those 36 years have gone by fast. I got busier when in 1986, athletic director at Warren, Howard Emerson, asked me if I would like to do the athletic *Continued on Page 2*



training for the football team. I told him I would try it for a couple of years. This fall I will be entering my 27th season with WAO sports."

During those years Jerry has treated many injuries as well as formed some great friendships with athletes, parents and coaches alike. Working with the athletes is one of the most enjoyable and rewarding parts of his work schedule. He stated "There are three phases that I look forward to when working with WAO athletics. First, of course, are the athletes. Their dedication and enthusiasm have always kept me young and enjoying the game. At 57, I still get "gut-turning" butterflies before the "Big Game" that I got back in high school. After 26 seasons, the athletes have provided me with many stories that get better each time I tell them."

The other two phases involve his relationship with the Pony coaches and the parents/ fans. He continued, "It has been a privilege working with the coaches over the years. They have always made my job easier. They have always made me feel part of the staff, even though the hours of work they put in far exceeds mine. I still get a lot of enjoyment seeing the look in their eyes every time I offer a suggestion on what football play they should run next. As for the parents and fans, they have always been supportive and appreciative of anything I have done for athletics. It's nice to work at a place where the health and well-being of the athletes come first." It should also be known that Jerry is trusted and respected by opposing teams when his medical knowledge is needed for one of their players during a game.

His job at the North Valley Health Center

physical therapy for people in the area. His office also works with the Northwest Regional Inter-district Council to work with school systems in the northern part of the service area. His department's primary referral centers are from Warren, Grand Forks, Crookston, Thief River Falls and Fargo, but some referrals have come from outside the two-state area. Commenting about this part of his job he said, "Our primary focus is on out-patient therapy and we work closely with not only physicians, nurse practitioners and physician assistants, but also with area chiropractors and dentists to try and give the people of our area the best total care. As far as what I enjoy most about my job, the majority of my patients will tell you that I like being able to torture people and get paid for it. That may be true but the chance to see people come in feeling pain or lacking function and then to see them leave feeling better or functioning better provides the best fulfillment. What I like least probably holds true for everyone else, regulations and paperwork - the necessary evils."

For anyone considering a career in physical therapy, Jerry offers this, "If you have an interest in science and medicine, PT offers you a career where you can put those talents to good use. In high school, classes in science, math, anatomy and critical thinking are helpful. I feel any profession where you get a chance to help your fellow men and women can be rewarding and fulfilling. I would like to thank all of the people of this area for their support all of these years." In spite of the "torture" that he dishes out, the people of this area are equally as thankful to him for his helping hands and genuine caring heart he has for all his patients.

Future of Education

Dr. Ron Bratlie, Superintendent

I started my educational experience in a one-room schoolhouse in rural Detroit Lakes. After completing a B.S. degree, I taught Mathematics in Michigan for 6 years. While there, I received M.S. and M.A. degrees in Mathematics and Educational Administration, respectively. A Secondary Principal position at Twin Valley was my first administrative venture. After 17 years of small school Superintendent experience and completing my EDD, I focused my next 13 years on operations and construction in a large growing school district (Elk River) gaining national recognition as a leader in energy efficient and environmentally friendly constructed school buildings (green schools).

This resulted in opportunities to be a change agent explaining how schools could be "higher performing for higher performing students." I had the privilege of making over sixty speaking engagements from coast to coast working with school personnel, school board members, architects, engineers, and even politicians. A high point during this tenure was being the first and only K-12 educator to receive the United State Energy Association's Public Service Award in Washington, DC with President Bush presiding. Looking down the road, I see several things happening in the areas of financing, technology, and delivery systems. Since education makes up a large part of the state budget and the state funds are scarce, increased funding for schools will be very limited, at least in the short term. This may result in more pressure for local taxpayers to approve referendums in order to continue operations as they know them, or specialized bond issues to approve purchases such as technology, distance learning, and other large ticket items.

Technology continues to change faster than the weather. If we look at how technology has changed just in the past three years, it is probably indicative of



how fast, exponentially, it will continue to change. Therefore, we are taxed to even imagine what three years in the future will bring!

I believe that delivery system of education will be the real change agent in the future. Distance learning, on line courses, telepresence, and other mediums will provide opportunities for both youth and adults for lifelong learning, experiences, and degrees. Demand for people with vocational and technical skills will change the emphasis of curriculum that traditional schools offer today. For example, there are automobiles that will parallel park and even drive without human assistance, but who will service and repair these technology beasts. Not all students need to attend four-year colleges. Many companies and industries are seeking youth who have a good work ethic, willingness to work and, ability to problem solve. They want to train (educate) their own work force and sometimes even without a post secondary formal education. Therefore, school districts need to provide students who are prepared for a climate of change, challenge, and willingness to think outside of the box.

The Foundation continues to provide funding for special requests from school personnel and for benefits of all of the students of Warren-Alvarado-Oslo District 2176. On behalf of the School Board, administrators, and staff, I want to express our appreciation for your contributions and support of students and staff. Providing a quality education for our children is not just a wish, it is our responsibility!

A Time We Will Not Forget

The WAO Education Foundation recently received from Marvin Swanson a letter and a donation in memory of the 3 men that lost their lives at Morris Point at Lake of the Woods Minnesota in 1947.

Bruce Fulks, 27, was the vocational agricultural instructor at Warren High School, and Laurence Deane Fulks, 19, young farmer and brother of Bruce, who served as one of the leaders during the outing. Deane and Bruce were the sons of Mr. and Mrs. Ed Fulks of Warren. Also Donald Novak, 17, Angus youth and president of the Warren FFA Chapter was the son of Mr. and Mrs. M.J. Novak of Angus.

A Warren Future Farmers of America Chapter pleasure outing at Lake of the Woods resulted in a tragedy when three members of the party drowned after their boat capsized. The three young men left the Oggren resort at Morris Point, located 12 miles north of Baudette, in a row boat to go fishing about 10:00 a.m. Wednesday June 11, 1947. The nine other members of the chapter had left the dock in boats a short time before. They returned to their cabin at noon for lunch but thought nothing of their leaders not returning.

Late in the afternoon a fisherman came to the resort and reported a capsized boat in the channel, and it was then learned that the three men had been in that boat. No one saw the accident so it was impossible to reconstruct with any certainty what caused the boat to capsize. There was a great deal of driftwood floating in the water following the terrific storm on Lake of the Woods the prior Monday and Tuesday, and it is possible that a large dead head together with a wave in the strong current may have been sufficient to tip the boat over. A wrist watch worn by Bruce stopped at 11:00, indicating that the tragedy took place shortly after they had left the dock.

The searching parties in Warren were organized by faculty members from the local school, including Supt. Eikenes, Emery Johnson, Paul Solberg, Howard Ernest, Stanley McCombs and Frank Forbes.

Other member of the FFA chapter who were with the Fulks boys on the outing were Robert Franson, Richard Melgard, Donald Bodell, George Erickson, Marvin Swanson, Harlan Nielson, James Pinkerton, Kenneth Sinn and Dale Borgquist.

Thank you Marvin for sharing this information with us and honoring Bruce, Deane and Donald with your memorial. If anyone else would like to contribute to this memorial plaque, please make a note with your donation in memory of the three men. They will never be forgotten.

The Gary Schuler Endowment Scholarship:

It will be given to a senior at WAO who exhibits many of the qualities and values that Coach Schuler cultivated as a coach and passed on to his student athletes.

With dedication and caring about children receiving a good education, Magda worked hard at her profession. She took great joy and pride in seeing the progress the students made with their reading abilities. Magda was a 1923 Alvarado graduate who spent her teaching years in the Warren School District. This scholarship was established with the school after her death in 1997, but turned over to the WAO Education Foundation this school year.
