



# Elementary School

## General Information

Cumberland County Schools will be offering a 4-week Summer Learning Camp for students who are entering grades 1-5 in the fall of 2021. It will begin on June 1 and will run through June 24 for 4 days per week.

- Week 1 = Tuesday, June 1-Friday, June 4
- Week 2 = Monday, June 7-Thursday, 10
- Week 3 = Monday, June 14-Thursday, 17
- Week 4 = Monday, June 21-Thursday, 24

This camp will include 7 hours of daily, in-person programming from 7:45 a.m. to 2:45 p.m., including:

- 4 hours of reading, writing, and math instruction;
- 1 hour of intervention;
- 1 hour of play; and
- 1 hour of S.T.R.E.A.M. instruction--“S.T.R.E.A.M.” programming will focus on Science, Technology, Reading, Engineering, Arts and Math.

## Eligibility

Eligibility for the summer learning camp is based on individual student performance on the STAR benchmark assessment.

# High School

## Basic Information

Students entering 9th grade will have an opportunity to strengthen basic Algebra I, English, and writing skills in the summer program. They will not earn any credits but instead review and build on needed skills to help students enter high school on track for success.

For students entering grades 10-12 and current Seniors, Cumberland County Schools will be offering a Summer Program where students may earn up to two credits (new course credits for selective non-EOC courses and/or credit recovery) that will begin on June 1.

- Week 1 = Tuesday, June 1-Friday, June 4
- Week 2 = Monday, June 7-Thursday, 10
- Week 3 = Monday, June 14-Thursday, 17
- Week 4 = Monday, June 21-Thursday, 24

On Thursday, June 24th, current Seniors who have finished required coursework and met graduation requirements will have the opportunity to participate in a summer graduation ceremony.

The daily schedule for students is based on individual needs but will run from 7:45-2:45.
