PUBLIC NOTICE

At 3:00PM Tuesday, March 24, 2020, the City of McCaysville Council declared a state of emergency in the City of McCaysville due to the COVID-19 virus. This action was taken with the support of the Department of Public Health. We feel this will help protect the citizens of our city and reduce the spread of the virus.

The declaration included provisions that prevent and prohibit the gathering of all public and private assemblages, events, and gatherings of ten (10) or more persons occurring outside of a household or living unit temporarily prohibited within the City and territorial limits of the City of McCaysville. Nothing in this Order prohibits the gathering of members of a household or living unit.

This declaration included all bars restaurants, or business who sell food or beverages for consumption on premises or provide entertainment on premises shall be closed to inn person dining, consumption of alcohol, or entertainment until the expiration of this ordinance. Take out or drive thru is allowed.

This declaration will close all gyms and fitness centers, movie theaters, live performance venues, bowling alleys and arcades, pools, parlors, nail salons, hair salons and private social clubs and any facility used for entertainment, social, and grooming within the jurisdictional limits of the City of McCaysville shall be closed to in person events, entertainment, meetings and activities of any kind until the expiration of the this ordinance.

All other establishments not covered in this declaration such as grocery stores, pharmacies, and other business which remain open during the emergency must post signage on entrance doors informing consumers to maintain at least 6ft of personal distance between themselves and others and shall not allow more than 10 people into such establishment at one time if such social distancing cannot be maintained.
