## **Sports Highlights**

#### **Calhoun Eagles Attend Tiger Classic**

The Calhoun Lady Eagles opened play in the Tiger Classic, held at Kingsville, on Monday night, December 4, vs. Heartland Christian School of Belton. The teams seamed evenly matched, but the sixth seeded Eagles were eventually outscored by the third seeded Mustangs of Heartland, qualifying them for the consolation side of the bracket. The Lady Eagles played Chilhowee in the consolation round of the Tiger Classic on Wednesday night, December 6. The teams seamed evenly matched as the score was tied at the end of the first quarter. Calhoun outscored Chilhowee by 4 at half and stretched the lead to 5 at the end of the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter. However, the fourth quarter saw the Lady Eagles get into foul trouble and lose the game. They ranked 7<sup>th</sup> Place in the Girls Tiger Classic.

The Calhoun Eagles opened play against a very "hot" shooting team from Heartland Christian in the Tiger Classic held at Kingsville on Tuesday night, December 5. Heartland made seven 3-pointers in the first half to take a 30 point lead. Adjustments made by Coach Jon Stackhouse at half time helped Calhoun shut down the shooting attack in the second half allowing no more 3-pointers. However, the Eagles were unable to overcome the first half deficit and lost the game by 39 points, qualifying them for the consolation side of the bracket. On Thursday night, December 7, the Eagles did their best in the consolation round but lost to Hermitage. Hermitage led at half and never looked back as the Hornets triumphed over the Eagles. Calhoun played Miami in the final game of the Tiger Classic, on Saturday afternoon, December 9. Miami snatched the win by 5 points, despite Calhoun's determination to keep their lead through the 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter. The Calhoun Eagles ranked 8<sup>th</sup> Place in the Boys Tiger Classic.



gifts were encased in a cling-wrap ball of Christmas goodness, and the participants had to race to unravel and






unwrap them. The simultaneously rolled a pair of dice each, and every time

# **Counselor's Corner**

#### The ACT

As of August of 2017, the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) no longer requires the ACT to be taken by every Junior in Missouri. Therefore, there will be no mandated "Testing Day" for all Junior classes.

The ACT is still required for admission into most postsecondary institutions, and can help students earn more financial aid from the schools of their choice. All students are allowed to take the ACT any time during their high school career, as well as one semester after graduation.

In order to sign up for the tests, your student will have to make an account on act.org and register for the tests online. If you or your student needs any assistance in registering for a test, please let me know. If you are concerned about the cost of the ACT, you may be able to qualify for a fee waiver for the ACT. If your family qualifies for the waiver, please contact me for an official waiver and for information on how to use it.

## **BYU Independent Study Program**

I wanted to introduce a new program being run at Calhoun R-8 High School for our students. The program is called the BYU Independent Study Program. This program, sponsored and ran by Brigham Young University, allows students to take classes online during school time for school credit. The program is accredited by the Northwest Accreditation Commission (NWAC).

#### **Benefits:**

BYU offers multiple high school level classes that the Calhoun School District cannot offer to students (foreign languages, computer programming, etc.). Therefore, students will be given more options for their program of study in the future.

### Prerequisites/Guidelines:

Since this program is in the early stages at Calhoun, there are currently no prerequisites to enroll into this program. As we accumulate more data from our students, the district holds the right to make necessary changes to ensure the success of all students.

#### Cost/Reimbursement:

At this time, BYU offers self-paced courses and teacher-led courses. Self-paced courses start at \$152 per 0.5 credit (equal to a one-semester class), while teacher-led courses start at \$256 per 0.5 credit. Calhoun is required to always have an educator monitoring our students to provide help when needed as well. At this time Calhoun R8 High School will not offer a reimbursement to any students that enroll into this program.

## **Dual Credit Policy**

I wanted to send out a reminder about the school's dual credit policy. At Calhoun, we have many students that have been able to take and succeed in Dual Credit classes, and I hope to continue that trend. The Dual Credit classes provided by State Fair Community College offer our students the ability to challenge themselves beyond what the school can provide, preparing them better for postsecondary education, as well as many college preparation examinations (ACT, SAT, etc.). These are the requirements for Dual Credit at State Fair Community College:

#### Freshman:

Must have a 3.0 GPA after 1st semester

Must have a Letter of Recommendation from staff

Must Take the ACT Test

Must be in the 90<sup>th</sup> percentile of the subject area of interest

## Sophomore:

Must have a 3.0 GPA

Must have a Letter of Recommendation from staff

## Juniors/Seniors:

Must have a 2.5 GPA

If GPA is below a 3.0, student must have a Letter of Recommendation from staff.

#### Cost/Reimbursement:

At this time, the online tuition from SFCCMO is \$94/credit hour. The average class is 3 credit hours, but the classes range between 1 and 5 credit hours. If your student receives an 'A' or a 'B' in their dual credit classes, the school will provide reimbursement for the classes by way of direct refund OR paying the next semester of tuition up to the reimbursed amount.
