Please Report Student Spring Break Travel to CDC Identified Level 2 and 3 Countries

District leaders are continuing to monitor travel advisories and recommendations from the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), available at www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/travelers.

As several of our AWBLA families are departing for travel during spring break, we ask that you please stay aware of any additional areas that may be added to the list of high-risk countries in the near future. We appreciate those families who have already notified us of their travel plans via our online form and ask that families continue using that form if a scholar or any member of the scholar's household is traveling internationally this month. AWBLA is asking all staff, substitute teachers and families to report Spring Break Travel to Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Identified Level 2 and 3 Countries. AWBLA is asked to report Spring Break travel to countries with some level of CDC warnings or restrictions, which as of today (March 16) Level 3 Travel Notice are: China, Iran, South Korea, Europe, United Kingdom and Ireland and Japan. To date, there have been no restrictions for domestic travel. However, please see the CDC information regarding traveling within the United States.

If a scholar travels to any of the countries identified as Level 2 or Level 3 over Spring Break, parents and guardians are asked to send in written notification of their child's travel to their campus front desk or registrar. AWBLA staff, substitute teachers, and families who travel to these countries or any additional countries added to the CDC Level 2 and 3 list over Spring Break will be asked to stay home for 14 days after AWBLA returns from Spring Break (at home quarantine time March 23-April 3) and not to return to school or work until April 6 or when cleared by the school nurse or AWBLA Human Resources.

We understand that the current attendance guidelines do not address situations such as this, therefore, we must have notification that travel to one of these countries has impacted your specific scholar in an effort to address their attendance once they are able to return. We will work with each family impacted during this extended absence period.

Our Registered Nurses on both of our campuses have protocols in place to manage any students showing symptoms. We will also continue to work closely with health department officials to navigate this changing situation. To assist you, we've included excerpts from the CDC's travel information regarding travel in the United States. Also, our website is being updated as information becomes available.

AWBLA will share updates if additional countries are added to the CDC list over Spring Break. <u>Please see this</u> letter from the Superintendent for more information.
