Because <u>one</u> day of summer classes have about the same number of hours as a <u>week</u> of regular school, ATTENDANCE IS MANDATORY!!!!

- Students will **not earn credit** and will be dismissed if they miss **more than Two (2) days**.
- If a student is more than ten (10) minutes late to a class or if he/she checks out with more than ten (10) minutes remaining in the class, he/she will be counted absent for ½ day.
- Two (2) tardies will be counted as an office referral. After two office referrals, the 5th tardy will result in dismissal from summer school.
- If a student is withdrawn for attendance reasons, there will be NO REFUND!!!!

Because summer classes are optional opportunities, misbehavior will NOT be tolerated!

- All school rules outlined in the 2018-2019 Student Code of Conduct are in full affect. This
 includes, but not limited to, dress code, possession of illegal substances, defiance and
 disrespectful behavior.
- Upon the second office referral (Class I or II offense), the student will be withdrawn from summer school.
- A student may be withdrawn on the first incident if the behavior is considered a Class III or Class IV offense. Reports will be made to the police as appropriate.
- Students who drive to summer school must follow all rules regarding the use of personal vehicles on campus. The vehicle is subject to search for illegal substances and/or weapons.
- If a student is withdrawn for behavior reasons, there will be NO REFUND!!!
