

NURSES NEWS

Immunizations

Thank you to all the families that have updated your students' immunizations! I know what a challenge it can be, especially now. If your student still needs immunizations for school, you should have heard from me recently. Please notify me of the day and time of your student's appointment, and if I can be of any help, please call me! (928)505-6042

Screenings

Various screenings will be conducted through the school nurse office. If you do not wish your child to participate, please contact the school nurse.

*Lice:

The nurse is always on the lookout for lice. Please take the time to check your student's hair for these little insects. The nurse has information on lice and how to rid your family of them. They do not fly or jump, they crawl. They cannot live more than 24-48 hours without a host. They feed on human blood. Your student is most likely to get lice when sleeping overnight at someone's house. Pets do not get or carry head lice.

- Watch for signs of lice:
 - Itching
 - Nits
 - Visible lice

Parents should check their student's head before and after any sleepovers or camps. Remember, it will take several weeks for signs of lice to become obvious.

Parents – thank you for doing your part to keep our students and staff safe!

We ask that you follow this daily checklist before sending your child to school. If your child displays any of the following symptoms, please keep him/her home and report it to our attendance and health office.

- *Fever of 100.4 or higher
- *Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- *Chills, Coughing
- *A student with daily runny nose or congestion due to allergies should NOT be kept at home.

In the event your child gets sick at school, please have a plan in place of who can pick him/her up if you are not available.

Students will need to be out of school as quickly as possible for any symptoms. Your diligence will help us keep our students and staff safe.

Tech Safety

All students in Elementary grades 2 - 6 will be doing their online safety units in learning.com. I expect all elementary schools to be done with the units by the end of October / first week of November.

Grades 2

Online Safety: Cyberbullying

In this engaging and interactive digital lesson, the learners receive direct instruction and practice in preventing, stopping, and not participating in cyberbullying. They will understand what cyberbullying is, types of technology used for cyberbullying, and how to reach out to an adult for help.

Grade 3 and 4 --

Online Safety: Communicating Online and Cyberbullying

The learners receive direct instruction and practice in preventing, stopping, and not participating in cyberbullying. They will understand what cyberbullying is, its effects, types of technology used by cyberbullies, ways to stay safe online, and what to do about cyberbullying in this engaging and interactive digital lesson.

Grades 5 and 6 --

Online Safety: Dealing with Cyberbullying

The learners receive direct instruction and practice dealing with cyberbullying as they understand how to treat everyone with respect, avoid gossip, and the effects of cyberbullying. Learners are introduced to privacy settings and blocking messages as a way to respond to cyberbullies, and who to reach out to for help in this engaging and interactive digital lesson.

Online Safety: Digital Citizenship

The learners receive direct instruction and practice in digital citizenship and responsible use of technology. They learn about digital footprints, the importance of privacy settings and creating a strong password and how to avoid websites that ask for personal information in this engaging and interactive digital lesson.

SOME SIMPLE SAFETY TIPS:

Parents:

First and foremost Supervision is the Key!

Check privacy settings on your computer and browsers

When possible, tell the kids what to do vs. what NOT to do

Computers located in common home areas

Have younger students use kid safe browsers (example: Kiddle.co)

Kids:

If you are not sure about something, easiest rule is STOP and ask your grown-up ©

Keep passwords private from everyone except your parents

Get grownups permission for ANY new program that you want to try or use.

Always log out of a program or account. Do not assume just because you close the browser you are logged out.

Only say or write nice things online (message, emails, while playing a game etc...) ... My personal rule with my kids has always been if grandma cannot hear it or read it don't say it or write it!
