Houston County Educators Attend GACTE Conference







The students were in an intensive year-long program preparing for the certification earned both high school and college credit for their work. During the year the students also had the opportunity to sit for the Microsoft Technical Associate (MTA) and the PC Pro certification offered by the TestOut Corporation. Those students who successfully complete the dual enrollment program were awarded an honor cord at graduation.

The A+ Computer Support Certification is offered through Comp TIA, an international accrediting



consortium featuring companies such as IBM, Microsoft, and Hewett Packard. According to the Comp TIA Website, (<u>http://certification.comptia.org/getCertified/certifications/a.aspx</u>), "Candidate job roles include technical support specialist, field service technician, IT support technician, IT support administrator and IT support specialist. CompTIA A+ is part of the certification track for corporations such as Microsoft, HP and Cisco. Other technology companies, including Dell, Intel, Lenovo and Ricoh, have made CompTIA A+ certification mandatory for their service technicians."


