Mission Statement

NCCA provides a rigorous, relevant and engaging education with high standards and expectations which prepares students for life through a personalized, competency-based program that creates confident, career-ready individuals.

Enrollment Process

ELIGIBILITY:

- Between the ages 14—21
- Enrolled in a grade between 7 and 12
- STUDENT and PARENT must demonstrate commitment
- High School dropout
- At-risk of dropping out of high school
- Homeschooled students

REFERRAL:

- Referral from school district, if presently enrolled in school.

INTERVIEW:

- All students must go through an intake interview.

DIPLOMA OPTIONS:

- Sending School District Diploma
- North Country Charter Academy Diploma

ACADEMICS:

Upon acceptance into the Academy, student records from the sending school district are reviewed. Academic assessments are given during the first week of class. From this data, an individual learning plan (ILP) is established to address credit requirements. Each center offers students either a morning or afternoon session depending on availability.

- **Littleton:** 8:00 a.m. to 11 a.m. or 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.
- **Lancaster:** 8:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. or 11:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.

EXTENDED LEARNING ELECTIVE PROGRAM:

Each student has the option to participate and complete an extended learning elective while in attendance at NCCA. The extended learning elective gives the student an opportunity to acquire elective credits in the classroom or outside the classroom in order to meet the needs of student with different talents, interest, and development.
