Important Math Skills for your
Upcoming Second Grader:

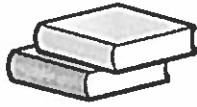
- * Addition facts to 20
- * Subtraction facts to 20
- * Counting by 2's, 5's, 10's
- * Addition and subtraction word problems to 20

Note: A math fact drill on addition facts through 15 will be given in the first week of school.

Math fact fluency is an important part of second grade math. Second graders need to be fluent in addition and subtraction facts to twenty. Help your upcoming second grader get a jump on these skills by practicing this summer.

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Focus on Fact Fluency, Vocabulary and Language Arts. Work in each category at least 3 times a week. Working in Math will also help your child get a jump start for next year!



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OSR Second Grade- Summer Reading List

Your upcoming second grader will be required to read the books listed below over the summer. These books will be used in the classroom for beginning activities for the school year! Your child will also take an Accelerated Reader (A.R.) test on each book during the first few weeks of school.

Choose 1 book from each of the four categories:

1. *Henry and Mudge in Puddle Trouble* by Cynthia Rylant or *Henry and Mudge and the Tall Treehouse* by Cynthia Rylant
2. *Just Me and My Mom* by Mercer Mayer or *Just Me and My Dad* by Mercer Mayer
3. *Days with Frog and Toad* by Arnold Lobel or *My Teacher is A Monster* by Peter Brown
4. *The Day Jimmy's Boa ate the Wash* by Trinka Noble or *Poppleton Everyday* by Cynthia Rylant

Your child will need to do a book report on one of the books. This report should include: Title, Author, Characters, Setting, Beginning, Middle and End of story. Students will be given an oral presentation grade and a reading grade for this report. They will also complete an opinion writing about their book during the first week of school.
