Teen Fathers Get the Big Picture by D. David Bryant

I am so proud of the 12 teen fathers that I work with. They have overcome many obstacles and hurdles in their young lives while continuing to run toward their future with excitement. The ages of these teen fathers children range from 5 months in the womb to 2 ½ years old. I just wanted to share with you, some exciting things about these young fathers.



Dad 1 realizes the importance

of his role as father. He told his friend they can't just call him at the last minute to see if they can hangout. He says he is a father now and his family come first. He asks for a 2 week notice from his friends, so he can plan his hang out time around his family and job.

Dad 2 was able to let down his "I'm hard, don't mess with me" wall, to actually allow me speak into his life despite coming from a fatherless home himself.

Dad 3 is starting to take his role a little more seriously now and understands his choices directly impacts his son.

For Dad 4, despite coming from a challenging home situation he vows to be the best dad he can be and is open to learning the new normal in parenting.

Dad 5 had a knee buckling event transpire in his young life, but knows that he is strong because of it. He always shows up to our group session with a smile.

Dads 6, 7, and 8 all have little girls and have shared challenges with me like doing their hair, or learning about tummy time, to just learning how to better communicate with the child's mother.

Dads 9 and 10 both hung around the wrong crowd prior to the births of their children. Since becoming fathers they have separated themselves a bit from guys who make poor choices.

Dads 11 and 12 are new fathers who are hands on. They have both checked in with me via text on fathering questions they have proving they are willing to learn.

A Home Visitor's Impact with Families

Brandon Gardner is the only male home visitor in Texas Home Visiting of Hays County. He along with our 7 other home visitors within hays county has been a great help transitioning good people to great parents. Brandon has a high rate of fathers participating at his home visits. From the enrollment of a family into our program he explains that whenever possible, parenting is a 2 parent approach.
