1. Call Meeting to Order

5. Report of Principal

- Covid Updates

Call outs are required for positive cases. These cases are not in our control. Spikes are occurring.

- Distance Learning

- Students returning/leaving

We have 46 students returning. We started the school year with 150 students in DL. 66 students will remain in DL. We have around 5 students that are choosing to go out to DL.

- Staff changes

Fourth grade is gaining a new teacher due to large class sizes. This will give us 5 face to face teachers and one DL teachers. Students will be pulled from classes to make a new class.

We are anticipating more students after Christmas due to growth in the area and military placements.

6. Old Business

- Fundraising

- 2nd grade curriculum (Fountas and Pinnell)

This was purchased for around \$7000. We are focusing on getting this program for all primary grades. There have been great results.

7. New Business-upcoming

- HCLI testing (fall/winter comparisons)

This testing shows us what level each student is on. Administrators will begin looking at data for growth. This allows us to know if they need more support.

- MAP testing (fall/winter comparisons)

MAP testing is for 1st-5th grade. This will help us project GMAS scores for spring. Administrators will check on growth.

8. PBIS Report- Dana Brock

Dr. Brock explained what PBIS stands for. She also showed the Matrix. In January we will start our Starbucks store. There is an emphasis on positive behavior. Dr. Brock has lessons that she teaches all students. We are in the emerging year of PBIS. PBIS has a team that uses fidelity to make sure we are rewarded by the state to get 5 points on our CCRPI score. Expectations are clearly stated on Matrixes that behavior lessons are taught from.

DOJO is tied to our behavior celebrations. These behavior celebrations are incentives for students with STAR behavior.

STAR expectations are stated every day. Students are quizzed daily on what STAR stands for.

9. What would you like to know?

One member wanted to know more about quarantining.
What are the parameters on knowing what requires a student to be quarantined? What determines if someone needs to be quarantined?

Dr. Rush answered the question in this meeting:
In classrooms, cohorts are established. If anyone in your child's cohort tests positive then your child is quarantined. Seating charts are required in all areas of the school to help us know who has been exposed. We also watch bus videos to see who the children are sitting around.

No one had any other questions, but Dr. Rush did tell members to please let her know if there is any other information that members want to discuss at our next meeting.
