

**How to complete the online personal finance lessons:**

-I am going to walk through the steps on Lesson 1.1 Taxes and Your Pay Stub. It can be found at the following link:

-Begin each step on the left side under Resources. I am starting with number 1 and then clicking on the blue text "Discussion Prompts".



This brings up a link I can follow to a short slideshow. The questions you can answer on your own or discuss with someone at home. The slides should look like this:

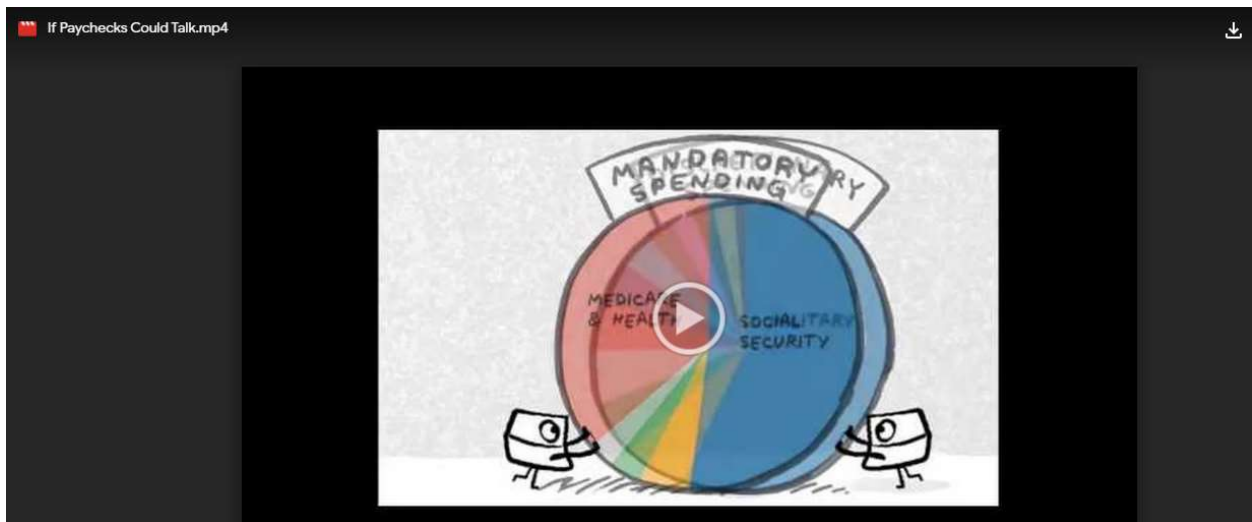

-I then close the slides page and go back to the original document to complete Section 2:

-Follow the same process as with part 1. Click on the blue text “If Paychecks Could Talk” and you should be taken here:



Once you watch the video answer the questions on the right again.

-Follow this process until you complete sections 1-6. The final section, number 7, is the exit ticket on each lesson. For this write 3 sentences about what you learned in the lesson.
