Example: Double Facts Hide, Seek, and Match

Materials: Sticky Notes with double fact problems on half the notes and the solution on the other side.

2+2=	4
3+3=	6
4+4=	8
5+5=	10
6+6=	12
7+7=	14
8+8=	16
9+9=	18
10+10=	20

Directions: Write down the double fact problems and solutions on different sticky notes. Have someone hide the double facts where they can be seen without moving anything. Once they are hidden the student goes and finds all the notes and then matches them up with the answers. This can also be done with paper and tape if sticky notes are not available.
