 - Flash Cards
 - Youtube Sight Word Videos
 - Sight Word Hunts- Look through a newspaper or magazine and highlight the known sight words.
 - Make a Sight Word Art Museum- Each word could be created in a different medium and displayed. Your child could walk visitors through the exhibit.
- ❖ Reading Daily-
 - Myon.org is an excellent free resource that gives children access to an endless amount of fiction and nonfiction title on many levels.
 - Keep a reading log of books, many business offer summer reading incentives to encourage reading by offering prizes.
